

ORDINANCE NO. 15-101

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FORT STOCKTON, TEXAS, ADOPTING BUDGET AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE ORIGINAL BUDGET OF THE CITY OF FORT STOCKTON, TEXAS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015; PROVIDING FOR SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION AND/OR TRANSFER OF CERTAIN FUNDS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATED TO THE SUBJECT.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Fort Stockton, Texas, adopted **Ordinance No. 14-114** approving its **Fiscal Year 2014-2015 Budget**, within the time and in the manner required by State Law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that revenues and/or reserves are available for supplemental appropriation and/or transfers of certain funds interdepartmentally is economically feasible and in the best interest of prudent budgeting; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend said Budget to reflect such supplemental appropriation and/or transfer(s) for the Fiscal Year 2014-2015.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT STOCKTON, TEXAS:**

**Section 1.** The facts and matters set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct.

**Section 2.** The Original Budget of the City of Fort Stockton, Texas, for the Fiscal Year 2014-2015 is hereby amended as shown on **Budget Amendment No. 1** to the Original Budget of the City of Fort Stockton, Texas, for the Fiscal Year 2014-2015 attached hereto. Said **Budget Amendment No. 1** shall be attached to and made a part of such Original Budget by the City Secretary and shall be filed as required by State law.

**Section 3.** In the event any clause, provision, sentence, or part of this ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstance shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part declared to be invalid or unconstitutional; and the City Council of the City of Fort Stockton, Texas, declares that it would have passed each and every part of the same notwithstanding the omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or more parts.


