

ORDINANCE NO. 17-107

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT STOCKTON, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 2. ADMINISTRATION*, ARTICLE IV. PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES*, DIVISION 1. GENERALLY, SECTION 2-61. APPOINTMENT OF CERTAIN OFFICERS; AND REPEALING ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR PORTIONS THEREOF IN CONFLICT, A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section §22.071 Texas Local Government Code authorizes the Governing Body to elect or appoint officers of the municipality; &

WHEREAS, The City Council desires to re-organize a component of the administrative operations structure to provide for greater oversight; &

WHEREAS, The City Council in furtherance thereof desires to reassign the **Director of Finance & Department** to full supervisory authority of the **City Manager**; &

WHEREAS, The City of Fort Stockton Organizational Chart shall appropriately be revised to reflect such changes.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT STOCKTON, TEXAS:

CHAPTER 2. ADMINISTRATION*
ARTICLE IV. PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES*
DIVISION 1. GENERALLY
SECTION 2-61. APPOINTMENT OF CERTAIN OFFICERS

- (a) **The City Manager, City Secretary, & City Attorney** shall be appointed by the City Council. All other officers provided for under Section §22.071 Texas Local Government Code, and all other officers or agents as the City Council may from time to time direct, shall be appointed by the City Manager subject to confirmation by the City Council.
- (b) All officers or agents appointed under this section shall be appointed for an indefinite period and shall be subject to discharge at the will of the City Council. Every appointment, removal or confirmation of appointment or removal shall require a majority vote of the City Council.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall compel the City Council or City Manager to fill all offices provided for under Section §22.071 Texas Local Government Code, and the City Council or City Manager may leave certain of the offices vacant at their discretion.


Severability. If any provision, sections, exceptions, subsections, paragraph, sentence, clause or phase of this ordinance or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances, shall for any reason be held unconstitutional, void or invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance or their application to other persons or sets of circumstances and to this end all provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

Conflicts. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed; provided however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this ordinance shall be cumulative of other ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this ordinance.

This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon approval and adoption, upon first & final reading and its publication pursuant to law.




